DOCTRINAL STATEMENT

Revelation Message Bible College is Interdenominational in nature; however, we hold to the following *Articles of Faith*:

I. **The Holy Scriptures:**

We believe that the Holy Bible is the Word of the Living God; true, without error, immutable, steadfast, unchangeable, inspired by the Lord God Jehovah; and penned by Holy men of old as they were moved upon and directed by the Holy Spirit.

II. **The Eternal Godhead:**

We believe that there is but one true and Living God; maker of heaven and earth and all that is in them; the Alpha and Omega, Whoever was, and is, and shall be without end; that in the unity of the Godhead there are three Persons, equal in every divine perfection, executing distinct but harmonious offices in the great work of redemption.

The Father-whose glory is so exceeding bright that mortal men cannot look upon His face and live; but whose heart was so filled with love and pity for His lost and sin-benighted children that He freely gave His only begotten Son to redeem and reconcile them unto Himself:

The Son-Co-existent and co-eternal with the Father, Who, conceived by the Holy Spirit and born of the virgin named Mary, took upon Himself the form of man, bore our sins, carried our sorrows; and by the shedding of His precious blood upon the cross of Calvary purchased redemption for all that would believe upon Him; bursting the bonds of death and hell, rose from the grave and ascended on high leading captivity captive, that as the great Mediator betwixt God and man, He might sit at the right hand of the Father making intercession for whom He laid down His life.

The Holy Spirit-The third person of the Godhead, the Spirit of the Father shed abroad, omnipotent, omnipresent, performing an inexpressible important mission upon earth, convicting of sin, of righteousness, and judgment, drawing sinners to the Savior, rebuking, pleading, searching, comforting, guiding, quickening, teaching, glorifying, baptizing and enduing with power from on high, all who yield to His tender ministries, preparing them for the great day of the Lord's appearing.

III. **The Fall of Man**

We believe that man was created in the image of God, before Whom he walked in holiness and purity, but that by voluntary disobedience and transgression, he fell from the Eden of purity and innocence to the depths of sin and iniquity. We also believe that as a consequence of this, all mankind are sinners, not by coercion, but by choice, shaped in iniquity and utterly void by nature of the holiness required by the law of God. Therefore, mankind is positively inclined to evil, guilty and without excuse, justly deserving the condemnation of a just and Holy God.

IV. The Plan of Redemption

We believe that while we were yet sinners Christ died for us, the just for the unjust; freely, and by divine appointment of the Father, taking the sinner's place, bearing his sins, receiving his condemnation, dying his death, fully paying his penalty, and signing with His life's blood, the pardon of everyone who should believe upon Him; that upon simple faith and acceptance of the atonement purchased on Mount Calvary, the vilest sinner may be cleansed of his iniquities and made whiter than the driven snow.

V. Salvation Through Grace

We believe that the salvation of sinners is wholly through grace; that we have no righteousness or goodness of our own wherewith to seek divine favor, and must come, therefore, throwing ourselves upon the unfailing mercy and life of Him who bought us and washed us in His blood, pleading the merits and righteousness of Christ the Savior, standing upon His word and accepting the free gifts of His love and pardon.

VI. The Baptism of the Holy Spirit

We believe that the Baptism of the Holy Spirit is the incoming of the promised Comforter in might and glorious fullness to endue the believer with power from on high and thus enable him for purposes: to glorify and exalt the Lord Jesus; to give inspired utterance in witness of Him; to foster the spirit of prayer, holiness, sobriety; to equip the individual and the Church for practical, efficient, joyous, Spirit-filled soul –winning in the fields of life. We believe that this being the dispensation of the Holy Spirit, the believer may have every reason to expect His incoming to be after the same manner as that in which He came upon Jew and Gentile alike in Bible days, and as recorded in the Word.

VII. The Second Coming of Christ

We believe that the Second Coming of Christ is personal and imminent; that He will descend from Heaven in the clouds of glory with the voice of the Archangel and with the trump of God; and that at this hour, which no man knows beforehand, the dead in Christ shall arise; then the redeemed that are alive and remain shall be caught up together with them in the clouds, to meet the Lord in the air, and that so shall they ever be with the Lord.

VIII. Marriage

We believe the Bible teaches that marriage is ordained by God and is the union between one man and one woman.

IX. Sanctity of Life

We believe the Bible teaches that all human life is sacred and begins at conception.

ADMISSION INFORMATION

Applicants for admission to Revelation Message Bible College (**RMBC**) are considered without regard to sex, age, color, or national origin. Each prospective student will be assessed per his or her academic background and experience.

An application must be made on the official form furnished by the admissions office. A copy is available on our website or can be requested by mail, fax, or email. We also offer the option to apply online using the online application. Once the admissions office receives an application, the appropriate fees, official transcripts of all earned credit, and documentation of all seminars, Bible study courses taken, and workshops attended, the student will be evaluated to determine his or her academic needs by the Academic Dean of **RMBC**. The Admissions Office will then notify the student by mail and/or email, regarding acceptance and credits needed for a degree.

Once applicants have received official notice that they have been accepted as students, and their evaluation is complete; they may begin ordering courses. Courses may also be taken at **RMBC**, at home, online, or at any Facilitator location. All degree programs are available online. Online programs are offered to all students, both those who are working with a Facilitator and those who are not.

Once all the requirements for an individual course have been completed, they are then to be mailed to **RMBC** or submitted through our online system. DISMISSAL and RE-ADMISSION POLICIES

REPEATING A COURSE

Unintentional plagiarism will result in lowering the grade of the paper by one letter grade. **Blatant plagiarism will result in the failure of the course or re-writing of the entire thesis/dissertation or dismissal.**

ALL OF THE FOLLOWING ARE CONSIDERED PLAGIARISM:

- turning in someone else's work as your own
- copying words or ideas from someone else without giving credit
- failing to put a quotation in quotation marks
- giving incorrect information about the source of a quotation
- changing words but copying the sentence structure of a source without giving credit
- copying so many words or ideas from a source that it makes up the majority of your work, whether you give credit or not

DESCRIPTION OF DEGREES

Biblical Studies	is designed to give the student a strong foundation and deeper understanding of Biblical Truths
Christian Business	is designed to equip the student to not only excel in the work force but Minister the Gospel through and in the marketplace.
Christian Counseling	is designed to equip the student to minister as a Biblical Counselor. This program specifically equips students to minister counseling either to individuals or with in groups.
Christian Education	is designed to equip the student to lead, manage and teach in the classroom environment. This program is geared for those wanting to be teachers in a Christian based school program.
Evangelism	is designed to equip the student to be the voice and feet of the Gospel by going in to the all the world and proclaiming the Good News, to actively reach out to a lost and dying world.
Ministry	is designed to equip the student to minister either as a Pastor or help support the Pastoral staff with in the Church. This program specifically equips students to minister to the body of Christ and deals with Church growth and development as well as community outreach.
Religious Education	is designed to equip the student to Minister to and train the next generation of believers. This program specifically teaches how to run and lead effective Children's Church programs that are so needed in this day and hour.
Theology	is designed to equip the student with an in-depth study of Biblical doctrines and is the study of Christian belief and practice, this is based upon the texts of the Old Testament and the New Testament.
Worship Leadership	is designed to equip the student to minister as an effective Praise and Worship Leader. This program focuses on the development and practice of worship and equips the student to be knowledgeable and capable of leading others in to the presence of God, while honoring the position of the Pastor.

CREDIT INFORMATION

There are three ways to earn credit at RMBC:

1. Transfer Credit:

RMBC will evaluate and accept in transfer all completed courses passed at any approved institution. These courses will be evaluated and recorded on the official transcript. Only courses that can be applied to **RMBC** degree programs will be accepted as transfer credits. All transfer credits must be received by **RMBC** from the institution where the credit was earned. Transcripts must indicate “Official Transcript” and signed by the Registrar of that institution.

2. Prior Learning Credit: (Maximum credit allowed: 30 hours)

RMBC awards credits for prior learning, seminars, study course classes, and workshops attended through work or church **as long as they correspond** to the course of study the student is involved in for his or her degree. For every 12.5 hours of actual attendance at seminars, study course classes, or workshops; **RMBC** will award one credit hour. The church or facility giving the seminar, study course class, or workshop must document all CEU credit. If for some reason documentation cannot be obtained from the facility, the applicant must present a **notarized** statement indicating he or she has attended the seminar, study course class, or workshop, and indicate the dates attended and the hours involved. Prior learning credit will be given as follows: For each year of work that is related to his or her course of study, the student will be given nine (9) credit hours.

3. Course Completion:

RMBC offers in-house classes on campus and at other locations as well as provides Distant Learning and Online courses for students to take in the privacy of their own home and to operate at their own pace. Contact our office to get a schedule of classes being offered on campus.

ASSOCIATE DEGREE PROGRAM

Requires 60 Credit Hours

In order to enter into the Associate Degree program, a student must possess a high school diploma or its equivalent.

Materials for each course in this program consist of a series of audio lectures, a textbook, or a workbook. The student is required to listen to the audio lectures; or to read the textbook and then answer the questions prepared by RMBC for the audio lectures or textbook. This process may require listening to the audio lectures or reading the textbook several times. Students are then required **to prepare an outline** of the contents of **each audio lesson**, or **each chapter** in the textbook. The outline is to be a minimum of five points per chapter or audio lesson. Also, the student is required **to type a five paragraph Essay** describing three things that he or she learned from the course. **In addition**, the student is required **to read an ADDITIONAL book** that is related to the subject being taught and **to prepare a three (3) page book report**, of the **ADDITIONAL book**. For courses using **workbooks**, the student is required **to complete the workbook** and **to write a summary** of the theme of the book(s) of the Bible that is/are used in the workbook. All outlines, essays, and summaries are to be prepared as per the required format provided in the appendix of this catalog and must have a cover page.

For each Audio, or textbook course in the Associate Program, the course **test** will comprise **40%** of the course grade, the **outlines** will comprise **10%** of the course grade, the **essays** will comprise **20%** of the course grade, and the **book report** will comprise **30%** of the course grade. **For Bible courses using workbooks and General Studies Courses, the test will comprise 60% of the course grade, and the essay will comprise 30% of the course grade as there is no outline or book report.**

***NOTE:** A student cannot begin studies in a new course unless all requirements for the previous course have been completed and submitted.*

In order to be considered as a third-year student at Revelation Message Bible College, a student must have completed sixty (60) hours of college credit or its equivalent

Materials for each course in this program are audio lectures, textbooks, or workbooks. The student is required to listen to the audio lectures, or to read the textbook and then answer the questions prepared by RMBC for the audio lectures or textbook. This process may require listening to the audio lectures or reading the textbook several times. The student is then required **to prepare an outline** from each audio lesson, or each chapter in the textbook. Also, the student is required **to type a five paragraph Essay** describing three things that he or she learned from the course. In addition, the student is required **to read an ADDITIONAL book** that is related to the subject matter being taught and **to prepare a three (3) page book report**, of the **ADDITIONAL book**. For courses using **workbooks**, the student is required **to complete the workbook** and **to write an Essay** of the theme of the book(s) of the Bible that is/are used in the workbook. All outlines, essays, and are to be prepared as per the required format provided in the appendix of this catalog.

For each course in the Bachelor's Program, the course **tests** will comprise **40%**, the **outlines** will comprise **10%**, the **essays** will comprise **20%**, and the **book report** will comprise **30%** of the course grade. **For Bible courses using workbooks and General Studies Courses, the test will comprise 70% of the course grade, the outline with comprise of 10% and the essay will comprise 20% of the course grade as there is no book report.**

Note: *A student cannot begin studies in a new course unless all requirements for the previous course have been completed and submitted.*

Cover Pages and Page Numbering:

Each section of your written work Outline, Essay and Book Report should have a cover page as well as the number of pages in the footer.

In addition to the above-prescribed course of study, all bachelor level degrees (**except Bachelor of Ministry and Bachelor of Biblical Studies**) require a **Thesis**, in MLA form, consisting of **five (5)** outside sources. The Thesis is to have a **minimum of thirty-five (35)** and a **maximum of fifty (50)** **typewritten** (double-spaced) pages. **The topic for the thesis MUST be pre-approved by the Academic Dean of Revelation Message Bible College.**

THIRD YEAR REQUIREMENTS

30 Hours of College Credit

If a student does not have college credits or CEU's to transfer in, he or she must take 10 courses (30 hours) from those listed in the "Description of Courses" in this catalog. A student may choose any of the courses listed except the required courses in his or her field of study. *If the student has not taken the required General Studies & Foundational courses, he or she must take any that are missing at this time. This course examines the way and methods Christ used to create the most successful organization of all time. Using practical modern illustrations and anecdotes, this course will show business leaders how to succeed in today's challenging marketplace.
- CB 4193 Ten Commandments for Working in a Hostile Environment Textbook
 T.D. Jakes / Dr. Fabienne M. Naomi
This course is for any one that has ever hated the thought of getting out of bed and going to work. The principles covered in this course, if practiced will reward the student with strength, hope and courage that has made champions triumph over adversity.

CHRISTIAN COUNSELING DIVISION

- CC 413 Counseling Practicum
This course requires observing, participating, and directed counseling in an approved counseling setting in the area where the student lives and will be carried out under the supervision of an approved supervising counselor. Forty-five (45) supervised counseling hours are required.
- CC 423 Equipping Saints to Counsel Audio
Dr. M.R. Burckley-Frost
This course is designed to provide Christian counselors with biblical knowledge of the techniques and methods of Jesus when counseling.
- CC 433 Ethics and Legal Issues in Christian Counseling Audio
Dr. M.R. Burckley-Frost
This course provides the student with guidelines regarding proper ethics and legal requirements concerning counseling and gives them information as to how to avoid legal problems.
- CC 443 Spirit Controlled Temperament Textbook
Tim LaHaye / Dr. M. R. Burckley-Frost
This course offers students an understanding into the different patterns of temperament and gives them the key to allowing the Holy Spirit to control their temperaments, ultimately producing and/or improving communication, which in turn eases tensions and dissolves unnecessary guilt. It will show students how to help others to improve relationships.
- CC 453 Introduction to Psychology and Counseling Textbook
Mark R. McMinn / Dr. M.R. Burckley-Frost
This course teaches classic theory along with added information that helps the student to correlate these understandings with a holistic, Christian view of humanity and counseling.

- CC 4113 Healing the Memories I and II Audio

This course gives informative suggestions to counselors concerning dealing with people who have psychological scars from bad memories.
- CC 4123 Crisis Counseling and Pastoral Psychology Audio
 Dr. Harold Vick
This course, by our founder, deals with how to counsel individuals during various crisis situations. It offers sound spiritual advice to counselors involved in this very delicate type of counseling. It also deals with special situations involving pastors such as; hospital visitation, proper behavior during counseling, and much more.
- CC 4133 Competent to Counsel Textbook
 Jay E. Adams / Dr. M.R. Burckley-Frost
This course introduces students to Nouthetic counseling and helps them develop biblical counseling skills that have been used in pastor's studies, and in counseling centers throughout the country and around the world.
- CC 4143 Christ Centered Therapy Textbook

This course will help show how to accept God's grace, truth, and time as it relates to us. It will help us to understand bonding relationships to God and others. You will learn about boundaries and how to develop healthy boundaries.

- CC 4173 12 Steps to Life Recovery Audio
 Dr. M.R. Burckley-Frost
This course will teach one how to take the 12 biblical steps to reach that place of wholeness God wants for His people, so we may enjoy the abundant life Christ came to give us.
- CC 4183 The Christian Family Textbook
 Larry Christenson / Dr. M.R. Burckley-Frost
This course introduces the student to God's order for the family and demonstrates how a family can practice the presence of Jesus and be a witness for Him.
- CC 4193 God's Truth versus The Lies We Believe Audio
 Dr. M.R. Burckley-Frost
Every day we are confronted by the lies of our culture. We have even believed some religious lies that stem from tradition. This course helps us analyze these lies and replace them with truth. "And you shall know the truth and the truth shall make you free." (John 8:32)
- CC 4203 Living Supernaturally Natural Audio
 Dr. M.R. Burckley-Frost
This course will teach us about our origins and how we can live above this world by applying the truth God has for us. This course helps us to understand that although we now live in this world, we are supernatural beings and teaches us how to live as such.
- CC 4213 Psychology, Theology, & Spirituality in Christian Counseling Textbook
 Mark R. McMinn / Dr. M.R. Burckley-Frost
This course attempts to bring together for the Christian counselor the three different avenues of psychology, theology, and spirituality. It looks at inter-disciplinary integration involving the practical implications of responsible psychology, Christian theology, and spiritual growth.
- CC 4223 Modern Psychotherapies 2nd Edition Textbook
 Stanton L. Jones & Richard E. Butman / Dr. M.R. Burckley-Frost
This course includes a careful analysis and penetrating critiques of modern psychotherapies. It gives understanding to each therapy and provides helpful guidance for the evaluation of psychotherapies in general.
- CC 4233 Basic Biblical Counseling Audio
 Dr. M.R. Burckley-Frost
This course offers the basic skills for biblical counseling. It will help the student to restore trouble people to a place of productive, creative living as well as help those who have been called to a pastorate to counsel more effectively.
- CC 4243 Crisis and Trauma Counseling Textbook

This course will prepare the student to provide hope and help when tragedy strikes in people's lives. It covers everything from post-traumatic stress disorder to counseling children and teens in crisis.

This course will help the counseling student to recognize the symptoms displayed by those who have experienced different types of trauma in their lives. It will further instruct them in the most effective methods of counseling to be used for the particular trauma experienced.

The Bible is filled with champions for God. We need champions today, and the way champions are developed is by one submitting himself wholly to God's will.
- CC 4273 Confrontation Counseling and Confronting In A Healthy Way Audio
 Dr. Kurt Huth and Dr. M.R. Burckley-Frost
This course deals with the proper attitude and tactfulness in confronting people concerning their problems.
- CC 4283 Counseling Victims of Sexual Abuse and Eating Disorders Audio
 Dr. Eileen Kelly-Cocke
This course will help counselors in dealing with victims of sexual abuse as well as helping those with eating disorders.
- CC 4293 Christian Living in The Home Textbook
 Jay E. Adams / Dr. R. Clifton Drawdy
Christians will find this course full of practical, biblical advice on Christ-centered family living, communicating with family members, family guidance and discipline, living with an unbelieving spouse, and many other areas. Counselors will value this course for its insight, clarity, and faithfulness to God's Word.
- CC 4303 Counseling Families Across the Stages of Life Textbook
 Weaver/Revilla/Loeing / Dr. M.R. Burckley-Frost
This course gives a description of therapeutic methods and the faith community's resources, which can provide relief and healing for twenty common issues experienced by families. These include pre-marital counseling, dual earner families, blended families, troubled teens and more.
- CC 4313 The Career Counselor Textbook

- CC 4343 The Biblical Basis of Christian Counseling Textbook
Gary R. Collins, Ph.D. / Dr. M.R. Burckley-Frost
This course will give the student a practical working knowledge of Scripture and the basics of the Christian faith. This course will help the student to relate the basic teachings of Scripture to people's problems. It is the core of what Christian counselors must know to be truly effective in helping others.
- CC 4363 The Renewed Mind Audio
Dr. Kurt Huth
God has made us feeling human beings, and He expects us to control our emotions, not to allow our emotions to control us. This course will help one to understand emotions, what they are, their origin, and how one needs to use them for spiritual growth.
- CC 4373 Introduction to Psychology I and II Audio
Dr. Ronald K. Powell
Introduction to Psychology covers the full range of important topics—from early childhood development to motivation and emotion to attribution theory, from the superego to the brain chemical called endorphin, and from classical conditioning to cognitive restructuring.
- CC 4383 Living Above the Fray Audio
Dr. Kurt Huth
Noah Webster's 1828 Dictionary defines Fray as: 1) A great crash, havoc, ruin, to break. 2) A broil, quarrel or violent riot, that puts men in fear. 3) To fright; to terrify. This course will show the student that a fray is a curse that we are to live above in the authority of our Lord Jesus Christ.
- CC 4393 A Practical Handbook for Ministry Textbook
Wayne E. Oates / Dr. M.R. Burckley-Frost
This course will help students understand the meaning of pastoring and of pastoral counseling and care. It will be helpful in gaining wisdom, clinical insight, and scriptural understanding for the challenges they will face in the ministry of caring for people.

You will learn that God has been speaking to you all along, he has called and equipped you for a kingdom work. You will also learn that your uniqueness is part of your kingdom effectiveness.
- CC 4433 Counseling Survivors of Sexual Abuse Textbook

This course is designed to help those in ministry understand the nature of crisis events, how individuals are impacted and how to provide effective aid during and following times of crisis.
- CC 4463 The First 48 Hours (Spiritual Caregivers as First Responders) Textbook
 Jennifer S. Cisney / Dr. Fabienne M. Naomi
This course offers a practical guide that equips the student to cross the road with competence and compassion. As first responders, it can make a difference between life and death and this course offers guidance in providing crisis intervention from a spiritual perspective.
- CC 4473 Prayers That Heal the Heart Textbook
 Mark Virkler / Dr. John R. Vick
This course deals with counseling through prayer. This course will teach the student how to offer a guide not only for others but themselves in healing one issue at a time. This course uses seven specific prayers that have been developed through an experienced counseling ministry of prayer.

This course provides the student with a Biblically sound and highly practical resource that will help to transform marriages.
- CC 4523 Sacred Marriage Textbook
 Gary Thomas / Dr. Howard L. Carmicle, Jr
What if God's primary intent for your marriage isn't to make you happy . . . but holy? What if your relationship isn't as much about you and your spouse as it is about you and God? This course invites you to see how God can use marriage as a discipline and a motivation to love God more and reflect more of the character of his Son.

- CC 4503 Conquering Post Traumatic Stress Disorder Textbook

This course will help the student better understand PTSD, in order to help those affected with its symptoms move beyond the trauma and regain control of their lives. The information in this course will especially assist those working with veterans of war.
- CC 4513 Stress After War Textbook
Julia M. Whealin, Lorie T. DeCarvalho & Edward M. Vega / Dr. M.R. Burckley-Frost
This course will give the student a number of coping skills for returning war veterans to use. These skills will help the veteran to better deal with the symptoms of PTSD and make the transition into civilian life smoother.
- CC 4523 The Post-Traumatic Stress Disorder Sourcebook Textbook
Glenn R. Schiraldi / Dr. M.R. Burckley-Frost
This course contains a wealth of information for trauma recovery and will help provide the future counselor with effective tools of help and healing for trauma victims.
Please Note: This course contains some techniques that do not line up with Christian views that Jacksonville Theological Seminary holds to. However, due to the good content in dealing with PTSD, we pray you will allow the Spirit to give you wisdom to retain that which is good and valuable and look past that which is not.

CHRISTIAN EDUCATION DIVISION

- CE 413 Teaching Practicum
This course requires observation, participation, and directed teaching in an approved school setting in the area where the student lives and will be carried out under the supervision of an approved supervising teacher by RMBC administration. Forty-five supervised classroom hours are required.
- CE 423 Created to Learn 2nd Edition Textbook
William R. Yount / Dr. R. Clifton Drawdy
This course will instruct Christian educators how to organize and tailor classroom instruction to fit the learning styles of students. In a real sense, this course takes the theories of teaching and learning and brings them to life inside the classroom.
- CE 433 Introducing Christian Education (Foundations for the 21st. Century) Textbook
Michael J. Anthony / Dr. David A. Carpenter
This course shows successful Christian Education Ministry in built on strong foundations. This course provides an outstanding guide to the integrations of Biblical studies and Theology with a variety of social sciences.
- CE 453 Early Childhood Growth and Development Textbook
Dr. Charles Schaefer & Theresa Foy DiGeronimo / Dr. R. Clifton Drawdy
This course is divided into four stages of child development—birth to 18 months, 18 months to 36 months, 36 months to age 6, and 6 to 10 years and covers all five areas of psychological health—emotional, cognitive, friendship/relationships, personal growth, and morality.

This is a course of the practices of teaching and learning in Christian education, and a detailed teaching of basic phonetic sounds and reading skills for the young beginning reader.
- CE 4113 Foundations of Christian Education Textbook
 Berkhof/Vantil / Dr. R. Clifton Drawdy
This course reminds teachers anew of the rationale for Christian education. It recalls the prophetic voices of two educators who were especially qualified to clarify the foundational issues in Christian schooling.
- CE 4123 An Overview of Christian School Curriculum Audio

- CH 353 Jesus and History Textbook

This course looks at the question found in Mark 8:29 “Who do you say that I am?” This course examines the historical background of the Four Gospels.

DIVINITY DIVISION

- DV 443 Pastoral Care in Hospitals Textbook

This course will help the student prepare to minister comfort and concern at the bedside of the sick or dying. It offers a practical guide, based on the many years of experience of the author of the textbook as a hospital chaplain. This course also offers a variety of exercises and a section of prayers for specific circumstances that make it a must-have resource for all who will work with the sick and dying.

- MN 4553 The Depression Proof Church Textbook

This is a study of the different styles of preaching and several of the most important Bible doctrines.
- TH 453 Doctrines of Victory and Prayer Audio

Evangelical theology is concerned with Immanuel, God With Us! Having this God for its object, it can be nothing else but the most thankful and happy science.
- TH 4123 Comparative Religions and Hermeneutics Audio
 Dr. Craig Lokken
This course gives an analysis of the major world religions in comparison to Christianity, and details rules for studying the Word of God.
- TH 4133 The Life and Times of Jesus The Messiah Textbook
 Alfred Edusiteim / Dr. M.R. Burckley-Frost
This course will give the student a thorough understanding of the life and ministry of Christ as it introduces a vivid background of the Jewish social and religious life of Christ's time and it also includes an overview of the four Gospels.
- TH 4143 Jesus: Lord and Savior Textbook
 F. F. Bruce / Dr. M.R. Burckley-Frost
This course explores the Jesus story in light of contemporary scholarship and Christian conviction. The author answers the question, "Who is Jesus, anyway?". Biblical evidence is examined as to who Jesus was, what His ministry was like, and how He related to His disciples and other Jews. It also considers His last meal, His arrest and trail, and His resurrection. This course will help the student to recognize Jesus as the Son of God, the Incarnate Word, and Lord and Savior.
- TH 4153 The Names of God Audio
 Dr. M.R. Burckley-Frost
This course is an overview of the names of God the Father, the names and titles of God the Son, and the names and titles of God the Holy Spirit as they are found in the Old and New Testaments: and shows how they relate to us and how we are to use these names in prayer.

THE FIRST PARAGRAPH OF THE ESSAY SHOULD BEGIN WITH AN OPENING STATEMENT OF INTEREST. IT SHOULD CONTAIN ALL OF THE POINTS THAT ARE TO BE DEALT WITH THROUGHOUT THE ESSAY (THE ESSAY SHOULD BE A FIVE PARAGRAPH ESSAY DESCRIBING THREE THINGS LEARNED IN THE COURSE)

THE FOLLOWING IS AN EXAMPLE OF A FIRST PARAGRAPH:

It seems that preparing to be a teacher is more than just knowing the material to be taught. This course has taught me that I need to be able to deal with each student in a different manner, that patience is a vital necessity, that I can learn from students as well as impart information to them, that teaching the lesson is only a small part of the work that teachers have to do, and that I have to earn the respect of students not demand it from them. (NOTE THAT EACH POINT BEGINS WITH THE WORD “THAT”.)

THE NEXT PARAGRAPHS (DEPENDING UPON THE NUMBER REQUIRED—AS IN OUR EXAMPLE, FIVE POINTS) SHOULD DEAL WITH EACH INDIVIDUAL POINT. YOU NEED TO USE A DIFFERENT PARAGRAPH FOR EACH POINT. YOU SHOULD USE TRANSITIONAL WORDS TO INTRODUCE EACH PARAGRAPH.

EXAMPLE OF THE SECOND PARAGRAPH IN OUR EXAMPLE ESSAY:

To begin with, I learned that every student is different. If I am going to reach each and every student in my class, I need to find out all I can about that student. Knowing his or her background will help me to understand why he or she reacts the way that he or she does. Some students need visual instruction while others need hands-on participation. Just knowing the material that I am teaching is not sufficient.

EXAMPLE OF THE THIRD PARAGRAPH:

In addition to knowing all that I can about each student, I learned that patience is a vital necessity for a teacher to possess. Sometimes it is necessary to repeat instructions several times before all of the students understand the material. Sometimes I may have to alter my progress of teaching in order to make sure that every student knows the material that I am presenting.

THE WORDS UNDERLINED AT THE BEGINNING OF THE TWO EXAMPLE PARAGRAPHS INDICATE TRANSITIONAL WORDS. YOU ARE NOT TO UNDERLINE THESE WORDS IN YOUR ESSAY.

Scriptural Roles for Women in a Church - Essay

As a Pastor, this class has truly been a blessing to me! There are a few important topics that are pointed out. The interpretation of God's Word, the understanding of the covering, Pastors having the desire to seek the heart of Christ, women are essential to Christ and the Bible is not a book of oppression.

First, the interpretation of God's word is very important. Often those who translate the Bible from the Greek omit or insert a word which completely changes the meaning of the verse. Unfortunately, many people are taught and led away from the intended truth of the Bible. The subject of women and their ability to speak openly in the church has been misused and abused. It will take people who are serious about the message of Gospel of Jesus Christ to bring truth to a dying world. Using the original text is where laymen need to mediate and seek Christ understanding.

Secondly, we need to understand the covering. No human being can cover any other human being regardless of race. Only Jesus Christ has the ability to cover and protect His people and institutions. Man, has tried to inform the body of Christ there needs to be some other form of shepherding. Romans 3:23 says that Jesus Christ was displayed publicly "as a propitiation in His blood through faith." Jesus Christ is the only covering available that will never fail.

Next, Pastors must have a desire to seek the heart of Christ. Too often men and woman of the gospel desire to please man and also themselves. God says He is a jealous God and have no other god before Him! My personal take is lined up with God's desire. Christ needs laymen to preach the Word in season and out of season, neither taking from it nor adding to it. God is Sovereign and can do what He wants, when He wants.

PREPARING A TYPED BOOK REPORT

The typed book report has three parts:

the *introduction*,
the *body*,
and the *conclusion*.

(The total length of a typed report should be three (3) pages.)

YOUR PAPER SHOULD BE TYPED (DOUBLE-SPACED) ON ONE SIDE ONLY.

YOU SHOULD HAVE ONE INCH MARGINS ON THE SIDES AND TOP OF YOUR PAPER.

I. The Introduction:

Introduce the title, the author, and the subject or theme of the book in the first sentence.

***Example:* Little Women by Louisa May Alcott recounts the girlhood experiences of Jo March and her three sisters.**

Get your readers interested in what you are going to say—perhaps with a striking statement, a quotation, or some background information. If the book has a setting (time and place), you might include it.

***Example:* Set in New England around the time of the Civil War, this classic novel provides a glimpse of daily life in a nineteenth-century American household. Though fictional, it reads like a true story, because the main characters are fashioned after the author’s own family. The character Jo March resembles Louisa herself.**

Close your introductory paragraph with a statement of opinion. Choose one aspect of the book—a moral, a concept, or a principle—that made an impression on you.

Ask yourself, “What did I learn from this book? Would others benefit from it? And if so, how?” You will discuss this statement in the body of your report.

***Example:* Though the experiences of the March sisters, one can learn to appreciate the family that God has given him or her.**

II. The Body

1. Begin with a short, concise summary (synopsis) of the book, including only the main points or key events. Limit this synopsis to several sentences.

1. For a fiction book, write a summary of the plot.

The plot is the sequences of actions that make up a story. The plot begins with a conflict involving main characters. Sometimes, the conflict involves two people. Other times, the conflict involves the main character and a variety of people and circumstances. In some stories, conflict may be at work with the character.

Example: In the story Little Women, each of the March sisters faces her own conflict with self as she tries to “be good.”

After you have stated the conflict, recount the events that develop the conflict to the point at which one of the opposing forces is about to prevail over the other. This is called the climax. Following the climax, relate the events that resolve the conflict.

2. For a biography, relate the chief incidents in the subject’s life.
3. For a nonfiction book, write a summary.

2. In the succeeding paragraphs of the body, use incidents, details, and quotations that support the opinion you stated in the introduction. Prove your point.

Example: In the opening scene, the March sisters are bemoaning their poverty when Beth gently reminds them how rich they really are: “We’ve got father and mother and each other.” Though lacking in material comforts, the girls gradually learn to appreciate the treasure they have in a loving home. Mother’s gentle words and Father’s letters from the battlefield remind them of the things that matter in life: relationships, kind words and loving deeds, and personal growth and maturity. Meg learns about the emptiness of material wealth when she visits Annie Moffat and tries to fit in with her frivolous and worldly friends. Jo learns to forgive when Amy burns her precious books. Beth teaches them all about selfless giving when she reaches out to help a poor widow and her children and is stricken with a deadly fever. As each girl struggles with her personal weaknesses, she learns to appreciate more fully the family that God has given her and the values they share.

III. The Conclusion:

1. Begin the conclusion with a restatement of your opinion. (Avoid the temptation to use the same wording that you used in your introduction.)

Example: Of the many lessons to be learned from Little Women, the importance of family relationships is one that no reader should miss. Everyone can learn to appreciate his or her siblings and parents from the example set by the March sisters.

2. Give your thoughts about the book, whether they are favorable or unfavorable.

Example: I enjoyed Louisa May Alcott's honest portrayal of family life. Like any ordinary family, the Marches had disagreements and quarrels from time to time, but they remained a close-knit, loving family because they recognized and practiced Scriptural principles of family life: the girls honored their parents, loved each other, and sought to live peaceable together.

You may comment on the realism of the characters, the charm of the setting, the effectiveness of the imagery, the aptness of the dialogue, or the naturalness of the action. As a Christian, you must also think about the content. How are evil actions presented? Is evil shown in a way that disgusts the reader? Or is it made attractive to the reader? Are the consequences of evil actions shown to be what the Bible says they will be?

In the body of your report, emphasize the moral, the concept, or the principle that impressed you. In the conclusion, evaluate the book per the criteria above.

NOTE: Keep the number of pages of your Book Report to the required number of pages for your course. Points will be deducted for long elaborate Book Reports. Remember, you are not re-writing the book, you are only giving a report of the book. Your paper should be typed (double-spaced) on one side only.

Cover Pages and Page Numbering

Each section of your written work: Outline, Essay and Book Report should have a cover page as well as the number of pages in the footer.

Scriptural Roles for Women in a Church –Book Report

Bigger Than Impossible by Lydia Chorpene, is a power book packed with Scripture that correlates with the mind of Christ and what every individual needs to do in order to gain the impossible. As children of God, we should live by faith and not by sight! Too often, we limit God due to our inability to trust what He says. APPENDIX B

NOTES FOR WRITING A THESIS

YOUR PAPER SHOULD BE TYPED (DOUBLE-SPACED) ON ONE SIDE ONLY

Note: The topic for a Thesis must be approved by the Academic Dean.

Guidelines for Restricting a Topic:

1. Become knowledgeable about your unrestricted topic by doing preliminary research. You might read encyclopedia articles or other reference books and consult representative sources from your working bibliography. Always avoid restricting when you have too little information.
2. As you gather background information about your topic, try to identify a problem or controversial issue about which experts or special-interest groups disagree. When you find controversy, you can be sure you are on a topic worth pursuing. When there is controversy, there is a problem to solve and an opportunity to interpret—for you to make your own sense of an issue, to explain or find a solution.
3. Limit the scope of your investigation. For example, you might focus on only one area of a particular subject.
4. Be sure that your research can provide sufficient sources on the topic and that all the material, that you need, will be accessible. Also, consider whether you will have adequate time to work with the materials and complete the assignment. Be sure, too, that your evidence is sufficient for you to develop a reasonable and objective thesis for your paper.

Guidelines for Paraphrasing

1. Read the source, looking for the writer's main idea.
2. Write down, in your own words and using your own sentence structure, what you think the main idea is. Order your paraphrase just as the original source is ordered; include appropriate details.
3. Check your paraphrase against the source. Make sure that you have captured the essence of the source and that your wording differs significantly from the wording in the original source.
4. Avoid plagiarism by giving credit to the author of the paraphrased materials.

Guidelines for Quoting: *You Should Quote:*

1. When the writer's words are so cogent and memorable that summarizing or paraphrasing would undercut their effectiveness or alter their meaning.
2. When you believe the writer's words will lend authority to what you have to say and will be more persuasive than your summary or paraphrase of those words.
3. When you want to take exception to what a writer has said.
4. When you want to comment on a writer's words as a way of expressing your own position or idea.
5. When you want to let a speaker's own words expose the weakness of his or her argument.
6. When you want to cite statistical information from the source

Guidelines for Gauging the Reasonableness of Your Thesis.

1. Is my thesis based on the investigative work I have done?
2. Is my thesis focused?
3. Is my thesis objective, fair, and deliberate, taking into consideration all sides of the issue?
4. Have I avoided a heated, two-sided debate or a simple declaration that invites resistance?
5. Have I let my readers know that I have considered and anticipated the responses of those who might disagree with me?
6. Have I been thorough in my research, or do I need to do more research on my topic to get a fuller picture of other points of view?

Guidelines for Incorporating Evidence

1. Clearly introduce and conclude each summary, paraphrase, or quotation in such a way that readers know where it begins and ends.
2. Ensure that the incorporated material blends smoothly into your sentences and paragraphs. Avoid shifts in verb tense or awkward phrasing that would contrast sharply with the incorporated evidence, making your sentences difficult to read and understand.
3. Provide a parenthetical citation within the thesis to document the source of your evidence and avoid plagiarism.
4. Be sure that you have adequate parenthetical citations and that each citation corresponds to the list of sources at the end of the thesis (Works Cited Page.)

Guidelines to Works Cited Page-- MLA style uses two methods for citing borrowed material within the text.

1. The author and page number of the source are identified immediately following the borrowed material.
2. The author is identified in the text and the page reference is given immediately following the borrowed material.

Use the following guidelines when writing with parenthetical citations.

1. Keep the citations concise but provide all necessary information.
2. Use an author's last name in the first and subsequent in-text citations. Use an author's first initial and last name if two authors in the Works Cited list share the same last name.
3. Place any punctuation marks in the text immediately following the closing parenthesis of the citation.
4. Include a page reference for the borrowed material.

Avoid Right-Side Justification. If you use a word processor to prepare your Works Cited list, turn off the right-side justification to avoid disrupting your spacing and your placement of punctuation marks.

Keep the following guidelines in mind when preparing book entries for the Works Cited list.

Author: An author's name (exactly as it appears on the title page) should appear as: Last name first, followed by a comma, then by the First and Middle names or initials. Put a period after the author's name.

1. **Title:** Copy the title and subtitle (if any) from the title page, not from the cover or spine of the book. Underline the title and capitalize all major words. Separate the main title from the subtitle with a colon. Put a period after the title and subtitle.
2. **Publication Information:** Copy the publication information (the city of publication, the publisher, and the year of publication) from the title and copyright pages. If more than one city is listed on the title page, cite the first one only. Put a colon and one space after the city of publication before the publisher's name.
